Dear Family and Friends,

Wishing you a very Happy New Year. I recently read one of my favorite writings titled, "A Year of Time" by Steven B. Cloud. He writes: "We see 12 months, 52 weeks, 365 days, 8,760 hours, 525,600 minutes, 31,536,000 seconds and all is a gift from God. We have done nothing to deserve it, earn it or purchase it. This is truly an exciting year for us, 2016 marks the 100th Anniversary of St. Edmond's Home. St. Edmond's was founded by Archbishop Edmond Prendergast, who in his Lenten Letter of March 2, 1916 mentioned the need for a Catholic Home to care for children with polio. The home originated at 44th Street and Haverford Avenue in Philadelphia and was formally dedicated on December 8, 1916. The home was administered by the Sisters of Bon Secours for 68 years. They were succeeded by the Sisters of Mercy and the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence. We have been truly blessed with leaders who had a vision and moved us toward that vision. With the development of the Salk vaccine and the epidemic of polio eradicated, there was a gradual evolution to the changing needs of those served. Due to the need of a larger residence, property was obtained in Rosemont, Radnor Township, in 1956 where we continue to provide services today.

As we celebrate our 100th Anniversary year we acknowledge the support of the community, the Women's Auxiliary, dedicated staff, benefactors and the on-going support from Catholic Social Services of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia who by their contributions have helped us provide an exemplary program where children are guided to maximize their potential in a loving joyful environment.
